Landfill Hours Change Friendly Reminder

Effective July 5th, the Town of Manila Landfill has updated its hours of operation:

Open Hours:

Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday & Saturday
7:00 a.m. – 11:00 a.m.

Monday Access:

Open by appointment only – please call Public Works at (435) 778-0038 to schedule or to ask when the town garbage truck will be at the landfill.

Important Notice:

All loads must be tarped and securely tied down to ensure the highway remains clean and safe for all drivers.

Garbage Pickup Update – Effective Monday, July 7th

Garbage pickup is now on **Mondays at 7:00 a.m.**, effective July 7th. Please have your garbage cans on the street by that time to ensure timely and efficient collection.

Helpful Reminders:

- **Place your garbage can on the street.** If it's not curbside, it may be missed. Public Works will return your can to the fence line after pickup to prevent it from blowing away.
- **Do not hang garbage bags on trees or fence posts.** These will not be picked up.
- **Double-bag fish waste.** In warmer months, especially if you are disposing of fish guts, please double-bag them. This helps prevent bags from breaking and stops maggots from ending up on the street.
- **Secure your dogs.** If dogs are not properly secured, Public Works will not collect your garbage for safety reasons.

 Public Works appreciates all residents who continue to bring their cans to the street. Your help and support make a big difference!

 Public Works will be out of the office the week of August 24th. To ensure your garbage is collected, we kindly ask all residents to have their garbage cans at the street by 7:00 a.m. the morning of Sunday, August 24th.

Well Improvement Project

The Town of Manila is pleased to report that two of our wells have been fully refurbished and are now producing at nearly historical levels. Work has recently begun on Well #3, and we anticipate it will be operating at 100% by Labor Day.

While this is great progress, we want to remind residents that Utah remains in a statewide drought. Although no formal water restrictions have been imposed in Manila or Daggett County, we strongly encourage all residents to adopt water-saving practices.

Please help us conserve water by following these recommendations:

- Avoid watering between 10 a.m. and 6 p.m.
- Limit unnecessary water use whenever possible

Together, we can help protect our water resources for the entire community. Thank you for doing your part to “Slow the Flow.”

Utility Rate Increase Notice

By the time you receive this newsletter, you will have seen the updated utility rates on your bill. While garbage pickup rates remain the same, there is a slight increase in water rates for all residents, and a moderate increase in sewer rates for town residents. Additionally, Xpress Bill Pay now charges a \$1.00 service fee for processing payments, whether made by check or credit card.

Utility rates must be adjusted from time to time to ensure we can cover the operation and maintenance of our systems. On March 18th and May 12th, Janell Braithwaite, Management Technician with the Rural Water Association of Utah (RWAU), presented at two public hearings. She reviewed our utility budgets and confirmed that while our water fund is stable, the sewer fund has been operating at a loss for several years.

To address these issues, the Mayor and Town Council have approved updated rate schedules to:

- Cover current operating and debt service costs
- Establish a renewal and replacement fund for future infrastructure and equipment needs

In the past, utility rate increases took effect early in the year (January–February). Moving forward, all utility adjustments will align with the Town’s fiscal year, which begins in July. The August 2025 billing reflects this transition to fiscal year-based utility planning.

We appreciate your understanding and support as we work to maintain and improve our utility services for the long term.

House Number Requirement

It is a requirement that all homes be clearly identified with their legal house number.

Effective immediately, if the Town is required to put or assign a house number to your property, a \$25.00 fee will be added to your utility bill. Please note that Bridger Valley, Union Wireless, and Public Works will no longer provide services to your properties that are not properly numbered. Thank you for your cooperation.


Assistance Available for Septic System Repairs

1% Loan for up to 20 Years

Our Foundation received a federal grant allowing us to provide loans to low income individuals. To qualify, an individual must have a HOUSEHOLD income at or below 60% of the gross non-metropolitan median household income for the State of Utah.
